examine such subjects as understanding colonialism and slavery; the prison/industrial complex; Black Lives Matter and policing issues; white privilege and bias/stereotyping; housing and education segregation; black women and intersectionality; and Jim Crow and the Civil Rights Movement. Ultimately, participants will acquire tools to apply this knowledge to Bahá'í community life and to use it in social-action projects.

In **Indigenous Perspectives on the Sacred**, we will examine the common threads found in indigenous spiritual beliefs and practices and the universal message of Bahá'u'lláh and in so doing will also inquire into how culture shapes our perceptions of reality and seek to gain insights into our inherent cultural biases. We will cover a range of topics: the historic culture clash between indigenous peoples and settlers; the use of language and symbolism in intercultural communication; the impacts of colonization and Christianity in the colonization process; and the effect

both have had on native religion and spirituality and the implications for the spread of Bahá'u'lláh's message in indigenous communities. In our readings, discussions, and consultations, we will strive for expansive thinking and will also revisit 'Abdu'l-Bahá's statement about the importance of the original inhabitants of North America and the Lakota prophecy about the rise of the Seventh Generation, reframing these statements in the context of the current Five Year Plan (2016-21).

How to Organize and Maintain a Baha'i Archives is an introductory-level course for those working with local or national Baha'i archives, but other learners may take the course and tailor their own special projects. Topics covered include basic archival principles and how to acquire, appraise, and organize official

records as well as personal papers, artifacts, and photographs. Learners then select and work on a mentored personal project appropriate to their archives and prepare a report and proposal to their Local or National Spiritual Assembly, if working with institutional records. The course is organized by the U.S. National Baha'i Archives, is taught by three Baha'i archivists, and requires Assembly permission for access to their records.

Climate change is one of the greatest social-justice issues of our time because of its devastating effects hurt people of color, indigenous people, and the poor first--all whom have contributed the least to global warming. Climate change is also an issue of justice for

future generations because human actions now and in the next twelve years will determine how warm the Earth will get, which will have an impact on the climate for centuries to come. With only 1°C warming so far, we have already experienced more devastating storms, heat waves, droughts, wildfires, floods, and sea-level rise. The Baha'i teachings offer the spiritual foundation and ethical guidance to address this problem effectively. This **Climate Change** course provides knowledge about the causes and impacts of climate change and stimulates reflections on possible actions at the individual, community, and institutional levels while connecting with deeper spiritual principles.

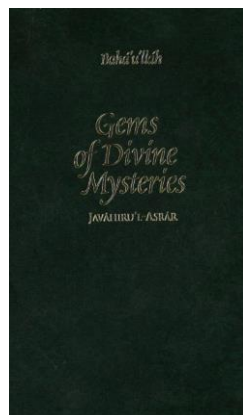

We will also study other Tablets of the mid-to-late Baghdad period (c. 1860-63), including: the Sura of Counsel; the City of Divine Unity; the Suffering of the Exalted Letters; the Tablet of Liberation (in which Baha'u'llah frees a slave); the Tablet of the Holy Mariner (both the Arabic and Persian versions); and the Sura of Patience (also known as the Tablet of Job), revealed on April 22, 1863, on the first day of Ridvan.

In **The Babi Faith, 1844-1863: Rediscovering the Dawnbreakers** we will study the earliest period of the history of the Babi and Baha'i Faiths--including the life and teachings of the Bab and the lives and exploits of His followers, the

Dawnbreakers of the Heroic Age--and will provide opportunities for meditating on the spiritual qualities needed for those who endeavor to live a Baha'i life and to serve the Faith. We will cover the birth of the Babi revelation, including the declaration of the Bab, the enrollment of the Letters of the Living, and the Bab's pilgrimage to Mecca; His banishment to Adhirbayjan; His imprisonments in Maku and Chihriq, and the Conference of Badasht; upheavals in the Babi communities in Mazanderan, Nayriz, and Zanjan; the martyrdom of the Bab in 1850; developments after the Bab's martyrdom, including an attempt on the life of Nasiri'd-Din Shah; Baha'u'llah's role in helping the Babis and His imprisonment in the Siyah-Chal in Tehran; the martyrdom of Tahiri; the executions of many of the Bab's disciples and the fate of those who persecuted the Bab and His followers; and a summation of the life of the Bab and His followers, the Dawnbreakers. Shoghi Effendi edited and translated *The Dawn-Breakers* as a means of encouraging Baha'is to emulate the bravery, self-sacrifice, and dedication of the Babis.
