




The gradual emergence of a unified global civilization that counterbalances the competitive struggle for existence with cooperation for the welfare of the whole.







In the Anthropocene, **where** and **how** we focus our attention is increasingly important







Risk Interconnection Map





FIGURE 1: NUMBER AND TYPE OF NATIONAL DISASTERS, 1950-2012⁵








7.5 BILLION

With 7.5 billion people, we are already overshooting Earth's biocapacity by 60%

We need the equivalent of the annual renewable biocapacity of 1.6 Earths to support present levels of consumption and emissions




But, we've only just begun







Restoring this much land would be equivalent to creating a new continent


