Introducing Chitra Golestani, the new Wilmette Institute Associate Director





Building a World Federation: The Key to Resolving Our Global Crises

October 1 to November 18, 2019

We will discuss solutions to the multitude of seemingly intractable problems the world faces--including climate change, financial instability, human-rights abuses, and nuclear proliferation--that are offered by exporting the principles of American federalism to the world, as advised by `Abdu'l-Bahá in 1912. We will explore both the American experience and Europe's federal experiment after World War II. The course will also provide tools for responding to skeptics who argue that nations will never be willing to cede sovereignty and that an abusive world government might emerge.

An Excellent and Priceless Heritage: The Three Covenants of the Baha'i Faith

October 2 to November 19, 2019

This course will be an exploration of the three successive covenants in this Dispensation: the Covenant of the Bab and what Shoghi Effendi termed "the twin Covenants of Baha'u'llah and of 'Abdu'l-Baha." It will focus on how these twin Covenants establish the Universal House of Justice as Head of the Faith, grant it broad authority, and repeatedly and emphatically promise it will receive unfailing divine guidance. The course seeks to enhance the participants' confidence in the guidance the Universal House of Justice provides to the Baha'i community and to the world.

Economic Justice in a World of Injustices

October 5 to November 29, 2019

It is commonly assumed that the economic health of a society is accurately represented by indices such as the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and that the human experience is all but irrelevant. In this course, however, we will view economics and economic justice from a totally different perspective: through the lens of distributive justice. According to the Bahá'í Writings, economic progress is perpetuated by justice. Issues of economic justice are fundamentally about the ethics and moral foundation of income distribution. Distributive justice is often considered not to belong to the scope of economics, but there is actually an important body of literature in economics that addresses social and economic justice.

Racism in America: The Most Vital and Challenging Issue

October 10 to December 11, 2019

This course will examine racism and racial prejudice in American society in some of its most serious manifestations, explore the content and significance of relevant Bahá'í authoritative texts, and consider how Bahá'ís can initiate meaningful

conversations and public discourse in a variety of contexts. It will explore definitions of race, racism, and prejudice, and examine such subjects as colonialism and slavery; the prison industrial complex; Black Lives Matter and policing issues; white privilege and bias/stereotyping; segregation, gentrification, and reparations; black women and social justice; and the Civil Rights Movement. Ultimately, participants will acquire tools to apply this knowledge to Bahá'í community life and to use it in social-action projects.

What Is Baha'i Courtship, Marriage, and Family Life?

November 4 to December 15, 2019

Come learn about being a couple, creating a marriage, and having a family based on the teachings of the Baha'i Faith. The course introduces principles that guide a couple through courtship, such as knowing each other's character and building a friendship. Once married, further spiritual principles help the couple establish their physical and spiritual unity on solid ground. Families come in many varieties these days, but there are always key

spiritual principles that guide parenting and family life. The course is open to anyone interested in better understanding the Baha'i Faith's teachings on these topics.

The Equality of Women and Men

November 10 to December 28, 2019

Develop a thorough understanding of the Baha'i principle of the equality of women and men and explore its application in our personal development, families, workplaces, Baha'i communities, and in public discourse. Explore the nature of human

identity and the acquisition of self-knowledge, equality in the family, transforming economic structures and processes, women's role in peace building and governance, eliminating violence against women, men and boys as partners in achieving equality, and the important role played by the media.



The curriculum will draw upon the Baha'i Writings, social science and policy research, and analysis and commentary. Special emphasis will be placed on champions of equality from Baha'i history, including the life of 'Abdu'l-Baha, and the use of case studies.



Writing Biographies and Histories: Recording Stories of People and Places

November 12 to December 30, 2019

The course is designed for Baha'is who wish to compose a memoir about their own lives, produce a biography of a Baha'i mentor, or write the history of their local

Baha'i community. Units in the first half of the course will cover such topics as selecting a topic and settling on an audience; the philosophy and ethics of writing biographies and history; collecting oral history; research in archives and libraries and on the web; organizing notes and outlining the topic. In the second half of the course, participants will pursue a research and writing project with support and advice from the faculty. The Wilmette Institute may be interested in publishing some short histories, biographies, and memoirs on its public website.

The Seven Valleys and the Arts of Transformation

November 15, 2019 to January 9, 2020

The purpose and method of this course is to actively use the arts to explore the path of spiritual development as presented in Baha'u'llah's *The Seven Valleys*, which describes the states and stations of spiritual progress. Each week, the learner will be responsible for reading materials related to these stages, and exploring topics and questions through an artistic expression, such as a poem, drawing, or music, along with a caption and/or succinct explanation (up to 50 words). At the end of the course the learners will be asked to present an essay, collage or portfolio of art created in the course or an artwork that summarizes what they learned and how this experiential process affected their personal growth.



Baha'u'llah's Proclamation to World Leaders: The Summons of the Lord of Hosts

November 20, 2019 to January 14, 2020

The course will explore the series of open letters ("Tablets") that Baha'u'llah sent to "kings and ecclesiastics" (the world's political and religious leaders) and, to a lesser extent, to scholars, between 1867

and 1870. Written after He privately declared His mission to select followers in the Garden of Ridvan on 21 April 1863, these public epistles, according to the Universal House of Justice, "summoned the monarchs of East and West

collectively, and some among them individually, to recognize the Day of God and to acknowledge the One promised in the scriptures of the religions professed by the recipients of His Summons." Baha'u'llah Himself says that this Proclamation was unique in the annals of religious history: "Never since the beginning of the world hath the Message been so openly proclaimed."
